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The Pediatric Audiology Program provides comprehensive diagnostic hearing evaluations for infants and children of all ages and developmental levels. Evaluations include behavioral hearing assessments and physiologic evaluation of the ear (tympanometry, otoacoustic emissions and acoustic reflexes). Electrophysiologic assessment of the auditory system (auditory brainstem response or ABR/BAER) testing is also available.

Our goal is to give families information and support for making informed decisions about treatment options, technology to improve hearing and communication options. Close working relationships are maintained with primary care providers, pediatric otolaryngologists, pediatric speech-language pathologists, the OHSU Cochlear Implant Program and community-based intervention and educational programs.

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The Cardiothoracic Surgery program at OHSU Doernbecher provides nationally recognized cardiac surgical care for children and adults with congenital heart disease from Oregon and the Pacific Northwest. The program includes an exceptional team of congenital cardiac surgeons, cardiac anesthesiologists, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, perfusion specialists, intensive care physicians, cardiac operating room nurses, intensive care nurses and allied specialists.

# Child Abuse and Suspected Child Abuse and Neglect (SCAN)

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The Suspected Child Abuse and Neglect (SCAN) team assesses children admitted to the Doernbecher Children's Hospital, Emergency Department or clinics when findings raise a concern for child abuse or neglect; reports abuse episodes to the appropriate authorities; and educates students, medical residents, faculty and community health professionals on the medical, social and legal aspects of child abuse.

Medical providers are available on-call to provide assistance to community providers regarding the evaluation, management and reporting of suspected child maltreatment. Reports of child abuse or neglect should be made directly to the appropriate county child abuse hotline.

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The Craniofacial Disorders Clinic provides evaluation and ongoing care coordination for children with cleft palate (with or without cleft lip) or other craniofacial disorders from birth through adulthood. Early nursing consultation to achieve success in the child's initial feeding efforts is a unique feature of this clinic. The clinic also specializes in naso-alveolar molding (NAM) to optimize primary reconstructive outcomes. For the treatment of velopharyngeal dysfunction, surgical and nonsurgical options are available including temporary speech appliances (obturator). Children are referred to this clinic by their primary care provider.

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The Dental Clinic at Doernbecher provides oral health care for children with acute and chronic medical issues. We provide emergency dental care to Doernbecher inpatients and will provide consultation, if requested by the child's physician.

The Pediatric Dental Surgery Program is a joint effort supported by Doernbecher Children's Hospital, OHSU School of Dentistry and private partners. The clinic was established to support other Doernbecher programs in the evaluation and treatment of special needs children.

In addition to Doernbecher patients, we welcome referrals from private practitioners in Oregon and Southwest Washington. Our clinic is available for consultation and treatment including sedation and general anesthesia.

Our clinic works closely with Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery as well as the General Practice Dental Residency program for older patients in need of surgery care.

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Pediatric dermatologists provide skin care and dermatologic evaluation for children and adolescents with skin diseases and conditions such as atopic dermatitis (eczema), acne, tinea capitis (fungal infections), nevi (moles), blistering skin diseases, hemangioma and vascular birthmarks, port wine stains and any skin birth defects and conditions.

### **SPECIALTY CLINICS IN PEDIATRIC DERMATOLOGY INCLUDE:**

- Hemangioma and vascular birthmarks clinic, where a multidisciplinary team evaluates complex vascular tumors and malformations
- Pulsed dye laser treatment of port wine stains, available weekly
- Surgical excision of pigmented and vascular birthmarks, melanocytic nevi, cysts, pilomatricomas, nevus sebaceus, and pyogenic granulomas – in collaboration with pediatric anesthesiology when needed

# Down Syndrome

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The Down Syndrome Clinic offers expertise in health and medical issues commonly experienced by children with Down syndrome and their families. We offer comprehensive, multidisciplinary assessments of children with Down syndrome from newborns up to age 21, including developmental and medical evaluations, as well as functional assessments, in order to develop individualized goals for optimal health and development. The Down Syndrome Clinic interdisciplinary team includes a pediatric neurologist as well as specialists in speech-language pathology, physical therapy, occupational therapy and audiology. Education and support regarding Down syndrome are provided, including referral to local organizations and to books and Web-based information. When appropriate, patients and families are referred to other specialists at Doernbecher Children's Hospital including otolaryngology, cardiology, dentistry, feeding/nutrition, ophthalmology, psychology and psychiatry.

# Echo Lab

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The Doernbecher Cardiac Echo lab is a Pediatric ICAEL-certified lab in pediatric thoracic echocardiography. It is the only lab in Oregon that is accredited in pediatric transesophageal and fetal echocardiography. It is staffed with pediatric-certified echo sonographers and pediatric cardiologists to provide the most accurate, state-of-the-art echo available, including fetal echocardiography.

All echo requests must be accompanied by a faxed order that includes the following patient information:

- Name
- Birth date
- Referring physician name and contact information
- Reason for request
- ICD-9 code

We will contact the family to register them and schedule an appointment at a convenient time. Echo results will be faxed to the office of the requesting physician. If there is a significant finding, a pediatric cardiologist will contact the requesting physician by phone.

# Pediatric Emergency Department

The Doernbecher Pediatric Emergency Department is one of only two pediatric Level 1 trauma centers in Oregon. This state-of-the-art, family-centered facility offers:

- Short waiting times — the average wait time is less than 30 minutes; most patients are placed in rooms immediately after arrival
- Board-certified pediatric emergency and emergency medicine specialists
- Specially trained emergency pediatric nurses
- Full spectrum of care from highly skilled specialists — our patients have immediate access to all of OHSU's trauma and surgical resources, as well as Doernbecher's pediatric specialists
- 24-hour observation — Patients who should be monitored overnight don't have to be admitted
- Our rooms are fully equipped to administer acute care and can accommodate overnight stay of a patient or family member
- Bedside registration — Most admitting procedures can be conducted in the exam room
- Comforting environment — Patients are directed to a separate, secure Pediatric waiting room
- Free valet parking

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The Harold Schnitzer Diabetes Health Center serves adults and children who are living with diabetes. Our integrated, patient-centered and family-oriented approach helps reduce the burden of diabetes so our patients can live healthy, productive lives. Our multidisciplinary team includes many pediatric diabetes specialists, board-certified pediatric endocrinologists, specially trained nurses and dietitians, a social worker and psychologists. Each patient's team is customized to his or her developmental level and particular needs.

The Pediatric Endocrinology Clinic evaluates and treats children with a wide range of endocrine problems, including diabetes; growth problems; pituitary hormone deficiencies; thyroid, adrenal, and gonadal disorders

and precocious or delayed puberty. Our multidisciplinary team includes pediatric endocrinologists, a pediatric endocrine nurse, pediatric dietitians skilled in nutritional management and a social worker specially trained in family counseling. The medical staff helps children and their families understand and manage their particular health situation.

The Doernbecher Gender Clinic provides comprehensive health care services for transgender and gender non-conforming youth and adolescents. Our Butterfly clinic is a multidisciplinary clinic providing coordinated care for girls and young women with Turner syndrome. A Thyroid Nodule Clinic evaluates thyroid nodules in pediatric patients and develops treatment plans with our multidisciplinary specialists.

Outreach clinics are held at two- and four-month intervals in Bend, Coos Bay, Eugene, Medford and Salem. Primary care physicians refer children to this program. Telemedicine technology facilitates diabetes visits between OHSU pediatric diabetes specialists and patients from the Eugene area, thus decreasing travel time for families that need specialized pediatric diabetes care.

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The Department of Molecular and Medical Genetics and the Division of Genetics and Metabolism provide both clinical and laboratory consultation.

Patients with either a family history or a suspected/known genetic disorder, inborn errors of metabolism, unexplained intellectual deficits, autism/developmental disorders, birth defect or cancer diagnoses are seen in both the outpatient and inpatient settings. They may be referred for a diagnosis, counseling or management.

Patients and their families are seen as outpatients in the general genetics, prenatal, cancer or metabolic clinics. Medical and family histories are reviewed, clinical and laboratory examinations are performed as needed, and counseling is provided. The patient and the referring physician receive counseling, recommendations and a summary of the evaluation. Specialized laboratory testing is available onsite for chromosomal (microarray), metabolic, and DNA-based diagnoses. Laboratory testing for hereditary cancer syndromes or other rare genetic diagnoses are arranged with other certified laboratories.

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The Doernbecher Blood and Cancer Program is the region's comprehensive children's cancer center and program of the OHSU Knight Cancer Institute. 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The OHSU Doernbecher Children's Hospital Pediatric Infectious Disease Service provides expert consultation for children with infectious diseases, including a comprehensive pediatric HIV clinic. The service also provides telephone consultation for physicians in Oregon. The staff includes four full-time and three part-time board-certified pediatric infectious disease physicians, a nurse practitioner and a registered nurse clinical research coordinator. Patients must be referred for consultation by a health care professional.

Doernbecher's Division of Pediatric Infectious Diseases houses an Outpatient Parenteral Antibiotic Therapy (OPAT) program for the care of children needing outpatient IV antibiotics. The Division of Pediatric Infectious Diseases is also active in clinical research protocols for new antiviral agents for treating viral infections in immunocompromised children, prevention of bloodstream infections in children with cancer, and laboratory studies for host defense and tuberculosis immunopathogenesis and tuberculosis vaccine and diagnostics development.

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The faculty and staff of our Nephrology Division provide comprehensive evaluation, treatment and consultation services for pediatricians and family practitioners who care for children with a wide range of conditions — including hematuria, proteinuria, hypertension, recurrent urinary tract infections, nephrocalcinosis and chronic kidney disease. The interdisciplinary team comprises four board-certified pediatric nephrologists, one nurse practitioner, two pediatric renal nutritionists, a pediatric nephrology nurse, a pediatric dialysis nurse, a transplant nurse and two social workers.

This team approach allows us to work closely with families and the primary care provider to coordinate all aspects of these complex patients' care. This includes advice on diets for children with kidney diseases, balancing growth issues, monitoring labs and medication changes and the psychosocial issues that can accompany chronic kidney disease and transplantation. Primary care providers generally refer children to this service.

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The Neurodevelopmental Clinic is a tertiary care referral resource for children with established or suspected problems with development. The program focus is on children whose development is affected by sensorimotor deficits stemming from nervous system damage or dysfunction. This clinic also provides developmental monitoring and assessment of NICU graduates who are at high risk for motor difficulties, developmental delays, learning disabilities or sensory impairments.

The staff includes developmental pediatricians, child neurologists, occupational therapists, physical therapists, speech-language pathologists and audiologists. Often other services are helpful and the team may include these or make recommendations for referral as needed. Examples include psychology, special education, social work, nutrition, assistive technology, dentistry, genetics, metabolics, neonatology, ophthalmology, otolaryngology, and orthopedics.

Pediatric Neurosurgery, a division within the OHSU Department of Neurological Surgery, provides comprehensive neurosurgical evaluation and care at OHSU Doernbecher Children's Hospital and clinics.

General pediatric neurosurgical care is available for children from infancy up to 18 years. Prenatal counseling with pediatric neurosurgeons is available for parents expecting a child with spina bifida, hydrocephalus or other conditions. # Oregon Poison Center

The Oregon Poison Center (OPC) is a 24-hour health care information and treatment resource serving the state of Oregon. The Poison Center staff includes doctors, pharmacists and nurses trained in toxicology. They utilize their professional expertise as well as an extensive variety of computer databases, textbooks and journal articles to determine the appropriate treatment guidelines for patients. A careful assessment of a patient's condition as well as the substance of exposure is necessary before determining treatment recommendations. The poison center staff also utilizes continuous follow up and evaluation to determine if treatment recommendations are effective in producing a positive patient outcome.

The OPC has an active public education program, providing resources for teaching about poison prevention, as well as stickers and other informational resources. The Oregon Poison Center provides professional education to health care providers and students from a variety of disciplines, through toxicology conferences, lectures and podcasts. # PANDA Transport

The Pediatric and Neonatal Doernbecher Transport (PANDA) Team provides immediate ground or air transport to OHSU Doernbecher Children's Hospital. PANDA primarily serves Oregon and Southwest Washington and also has the capability to provide ground and air transport services to other geographical areas depending upon the needs of the patient. Most transports are for critically ill neonates and children from referring hospitals in Oregon and Southwest Washington to our Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) or Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).

The PANDA team is the largest pediatric and neonatal transport team in Oregon, transporting more than 800 infants and children each year. The team is composed of pediatric registered nurses and respiratory therapists, all who are specially trained in emergency medical care of critically ill and injured patients from newborn to age 18.

A DNCC or PICU attending physician is available 24 hours day by telephone or the OHSU Doernbecher Telemedicine Network to initiate, triage and provide medical direction for each transport.

Our goal is to mobilize the PANDA Transport Team and leave Doernbecher within 15 minutes of initiating the transport. The PANDA Team uses ground (ambulance), fixed-wing (airplane), and a rotor-wing (helicopter) modes of transport. Decisions about the mode of transport are based on safety, patient illness acuity, and geographic location.

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The Pediatric Plastic Surgery Clinic provides evaluation and ongoing care coordination for children with congenital and reconstructive plastic surgical problems from birth through adulthood. 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The OHSU Doernbecher Children's Hospital Pediatric Pulmonology Division has the depth and breadth of experience to treat the broad spectrum of all respiratory conditions in children. We have a multidisciplinary approach to asthma, cystic fibrosis and other lung and breathing conditions. Our experienced staff consists of pulmonologists, nurses, dietitians, social workers, respiratory therapists and speech pathologists.

Common pulmonary disorders seen in our clinics include cystic fibrosis, asthma, recurrent pneumonia, chronic cough, congenital lung malformations, recurrent aspiration, neuromuscular disease, sleep apnea and rare interstitial lung diseases. Children are seen by a pediatric pulmonologist, either by referral from their primary care provider or by calling us directly.

The Pediatric Pulmonary Function Laboratory is the only facility in Oregon dedicated to children's lung function testing. Doernbecher and OHSU also have Oregon's only care center approved by the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. In addition, we are the only facility in Oregon with a comprehensive children's sleep disorder program and Aerodigestive Center.

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The Pediatric Radiology Section in the Department of Radiology at OHSU is known for excellence in pediatric imaging and diagnosis. Faculty radiologists are fellowship-trained and board-certified in pediatric radiology and have been recognized nationally and regionally as both innovators in the field and leaders in radiation dose reduction. They collaborate closely with a select group of imaging technologists who are also experts in safe, child-friendly imaging. The Section is dedicated to giving each child the best experience possible, to providing prompt and accurate diagnoses, and to supporting families through the process.

Toward this end, the Pediatric Radiology Section has a cooperative relationship with the Division of Pediatric Anesthesiology, whose members provide safe and effective sedation to patients who require it during imaging. Imaging services include digital X-rays, ultrasonography, fluoroscopy, magnetic resonance imaging (MRI), iMRI, computed tomography (CT), nuclear imaging, positron emission tomography/computed tomography (PET/CT), and image-guided biopsies and procedures. State-of-the-art equipment and child-sized examination protocols minimize radiation dose while providing exceptional diagnostic images.

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Doernbecher provides comprehensive pediatric rehabilitation services, occupational, physical therapy and speech language pathologists on an inpatient and outpatient basis, for children with a wide variety of conditions.

Doernbecher's Pediatric Occupational Therapy Program focuses on helping children and youth participate in daily life activities, such as self-care, play and school-related activities. Interventions are designed to promote development, establish foundational skills and address sensorimotor processing. We provide individual, multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary evaluations.

The Pediatric Physical Therapy Department offers an integrated and comprehensive approach in providing early detection of health problems for infants, children and adolescents. Our physical therapists specialize in the diagnosis, treatment and management of children with orthopedic, skeletal and neurological issues. We will work together to facilitate maximum independence by providing treatment, evaluation for equipment, orthotic needs as well as family and caregiver education.

Pediatric speech language pathologists provide specialized communication, speech, language, cognitive, swallowing, and feeding services to children at Doernbecher. Our program ensures that the child is followed by a speech language pathologist into the outpatient setting after discharge, when needed, to ensure the transition of care is smooth and the child continues to advance in his or her developing skills.

# Sedation Service

The Pediatric Sedation Service provides safe, efficient sedation services in non-operating room locations as needed to facilitate diagnostic and therapeutic procedures. Pediatric anesthesiologists work with sedation nurses to provide medical supervision and determine the level of care needed for the procedure or examination. Some procedures require very light sedation; others require deep sedation or general anesthesia. Sedation nurses provide the pre-procedure screening and education to help families and their children prepare for the sedation experience. The nurses also provide monitoring and recovery services.

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# Sleep Disorders Program

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OHSU Pediatric Sleep Disorders Clinic is a multidisciplinary program involving physicians from child psychiatry, pediatric pulmonary medicine, general pediatrics and pediatric otolaryngology. The disorders treated include obstructive sleep apnea, restless legs syndrome, narcolepsy, insomnia, behavioral sleep disorders, parasomnias (sleep terrors and sleep walking) and delayed sleep phase syndrome. Sleep studies, such as polysomnograms and multiple sleep latency tests, are performed at the OHSU Sleep Lab. The lab is located at the Marriott Residence Inn at Riverplace, where we are able to simulate an at-home sleep environment. Treatments include education, behavioral interventions, pharmacotherapy and potentially surgery or continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP) for sleep-disordered breathing.

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The Speech Language Pathologists at CDRC provide patient/family centered services for individuals 0-21, as well as some adults who are referred from our interdisciplinary programs. We work on many CDRC interdisciplinary teams (e.g., Autism, CFD, Down Syndrome, Congenital Brain Anomalies, Feeding and Swallowing, Rett Syndrome and others). We provide single discipline assessment and treatment services for individuals with a variety of complex challenges, including speech/language/cognitive disorders, hearing loss, voice/resonance disorders, fluency disorders, feeding/swallowing disorders, and those needing assistive technology/augmentative alternative communication services.

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The Portland Spina Bifida Clinic and the Eugene Spina Bifida Clinic staff care for patients of all ages with neural tube defects. Clinic activities include prevention through case finding, diagnosis and evaluation.

The team makes recommendations to primary care physicians regarding intervention, long term management and coordination of care.

The program primarily serves children and young adults from birth through age 21. However, people with neural tube defects may be referred to the program at any age. The program counsels families who have had a prenatal diagnosis of neural tube defect to help prepare the family for delivery, infant care, and ongoing management. Children are referred to the clinic by their primary care physicians.

# Stem Cell/Bone Marrow Transplant Program

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Doernbecher is the only pediatric hospital offering blood and bone marrow transplants in Oregon. The program is accredited by the Foundation for the Accreditation of Cellular Therapy and the National Marrow Donor Program. Our dedicated team of doctors, nurse practitioners, nurses and associated health care staff specializes in caring for children and adolescents receiving blood stem cell or bone marrow transplantation. We treat patients with a variety of cancers and nonmalignant conditions such as immunodeficiencies, metabolic disorders and inherited blood disorders. Our program offers autologous transplants and allogeneic transplants using related donors, unrelated donors or cord blood.

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# Surgery, General

Our pediatric general surgery team provides comprehensive surgical care for infants, children and adolescents. A collaborative team of specialists provides patients with individualized surgical care for a variety of conditions affecting the thoracic area, abdomen and pelvis including appendicitis and hernias, as well as rare or complex conditions such as solid tumors, pectus and other chest wall abnormalities, anorectal malformations and multiple congenital anomalies.

- Pectus excavatum/pectus carinatum repair
- Tumor resection
- Vascular access for IV therapy/chemotherapy
- Antegrade continence enemas
- Colorectal problems

Preparations for anxiolytic medications or conscious sedation is available for invasive clinic procedures. Additionally, the general surgery clinic offers specialty services for patients with ostomies and bowel management issues.

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# Urology

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Pediatric urology provides comprehensive medical and surgical care for the infant and child with structural and functional abnormalities of the urinary tract. Our urologists regularly provide surgical reconstruction of the penis, bladder, ureters and kidneys. We also provide care for children with exstrophy, hypospadias, epispadias, hydronephrosis, vesicoureteral reflux and many other abnormalities of the genitourinary tract.

In addition, our pediatric urology program provides a voiding and incontinence clinic for children. This is especially important for those children with day and nighttime wetting and associated urinary tract infections. Conscious sedation is available for children who are anxious or who have had a bad experience with urological testing. Children are referred to this program by their primary care provider.
